According to the Mishnah, Jews have four new years. The first of Nissan in the spring is when we count the years of a king's reign. The first of Elul in the summer is the start of the fiscal year for tithing animals. The first of Tishrei in the fall is when we count sabbatical years and jubilees. And the fifteenth of Shevat in the winter is the start of the fiscal year for tithing

fruits of the tree. For American Jews, we have five new years — January 1, the new year to restock our liquor cabinets! A happy and healthy 2023 to all.

Last January, we did not celebrate Shalev becoming a *b' mitzvah* in Israel because of the Omicron variant of COVID-19. Instead, we had a wonderful gathering here at AJ that felt like a real shot in the arm in the midst of a series of disappointing cancellations. Since then, we've been ramping up and programming is now back up to speed with the added bonus of hybridity. Our COVID protocols are hibernating for what we hope will be a very long winter!

As you'll see on pages 8 and 9, the AJ trip to Israel was fantastic. We all left with a real sense of optimism and pride about how Israel is handling food, water, and waste. Until this trip, I had conceived of being a light unto the nations in terms of policies that emphasized social justice. Now, I see that Israel is a light unto the nations in terms of being on the front lines of climate change and desertification. Technology sharing with California desalination plants is one thing, but helping Arab and Muslim countries survive an increasingly inhospitable habitat is quite another. One never knows where light will illuminate!

Our four-part class on Psalms was so much fun as we explored both what the psalm was getting at as a whole and how the Jewish tradition used the psalm, as a whole or specific verses, for its own agenda. Our next adult education series on prayer, beginning January 15, promises to be equally enjoyable and informative.

Beginning Wednesday, January 11, I'll be teaching an evening class for non-Jews considering conversion and interfaith couples. Limiting the participants to non-Jews, and their partners, will provide a safe space for them to explore the possibilities of taking on Judaism with other folks who are in a similar position. Please, if you know of anyone who might be interested in such a class, let them know. To quote Stevie Wonder, it's not about "shining the light of truth into their life." It's about making the wisdom and beauty of Judaism accessible in this open marketplace of religions. The class is comprised of three seven-session trimesters focusing on beliefs, practices, and history. If you are reading this, you are already an ambassador for AJ. Please, help spread the word.

One of those aforementioned Jewish New Years falls on February 5. AJ's L'olam committee will be hosting a Tu b'Shvat Seder. Bring your kids and grandkids as we explore the day's roots and consequences. We'll see (and taste) how the fiscal year for fruit trees became an opportunity to focus on our stewardship of the environment.

Finally, I want to reflect on what a blessing AJ's Year of the Woman has been for me. Each week as I prepare my dvar Torah, I am reading feminist commentary that opens up new vistas within the Torah. I am so grateful to have had the chance to read Ellen Frankel's The 5 Books of Miriam (Frankel will be coming to AJ for Shavuot), Tikva Frymer-Kensky's Reading the Women of the Bible, and the anthology of Israeli women's midrash edited by Tamar Biala, Dirshuni. These texts are all accessible to the non-specialist and come highly recommended.

May all of your new years be healthy and joyous.

In the Cantor's Corner

Upon graduation from UMass Amherst, I worked in marketing for Pioneer Electronics in Norwalk, CT. It was a very social place with a decent amount of water cooler shmoozing. I still laugh remembering that the biggest wow in tech at the time, a huge Panasonic FAX machine, took the majority of space in the coffee break room. Nonetheless, it was in that room that social chatting happened most. The coffee, mini fridge, and that gargantuan FAX machine witnessed it all.

Pat often had a funny sales story — he was animated, very entertaining. I looked forward to him stopping in from the road. On one such occasion, I thought I heard him exclaim "I gave the guy a good price and then he starts chewing me down!" Somehow, perhaps to my good fortune, I had never heard that expression. In the next part of the story he used the expression again, only this time, I realized it wasn't "chewing" that he was saying. I'm guessing you, as the seasoned reader and Jewish citizen of our world, already suspected it was the derogatory term used in a sentence including "Jewing someone down." I was still unsure, perhaps skeptical of my hearing.

I should not have been so naive. In the summer of 1977 (I began high school the following fall) I saw the headlines: Nazis to march in Skokie, IL. Terrifying photos were in every paper and magazine. Average-looking men saluting Hitler with raised arms and young Jews countering them.

I had already experienced the feeling of bewilderment upon hearing college roommates and classmates say, "You don't look Jewish" (I didn't have a beard yet). But those kinds of comments felt innocent, albeit ignorant. I mean really, what does a Jew look like? I wavered, but when Pat stopped in again, I found a time to speak to this talented salesman 30 years my senior and probably capable of having me fired. I asked him what is meant by "Jewed" me down. Pat's usually pink-toned facial skin drained pale and suddenly, "Howard, you're Jewish, aren't you? I didn't know." I tried to get across how it doesn't really matter if I'm Jewish. Something might have set in when I asked if he knew any frugal, thrifty, or even cheap people who are not Jewish.

I relive this as I read and hear, day after day, the mainstreaming of Jew Hatred. It is within these cummulative experiences that I was blessed to find an island of cooperation, empathy, and understanding. On December, 4, 2022, we enjoyed a bright Sunday afternoon at AJ, regardless of the weather outside our sanctuary. A delightful array of interfaith and


intercultural experience with an exchange and collaboration of music, faith, and stories was had by all. The idea of holding this concert is owed completely to our new Choral directorial team of Dr. Julia Zavadsky and Soyeon Bin, to whom we owe a debt of gratitude. This is the church in which Soyeon worships and she connected me with their faith leader to discuss the program.

The moment I met with Reverend Dennis Kim of the Cheltenham Presbyterian Church, I felt a sincere warmth and desire to connect in a meaningful way. We chatted about our families, our backgrounds, etc. Then Rev. Kim expressed sadness over the "news" and he elaborated on how awful were the hateful statements by a certain well-known celebrity. I was touched and pleasantly surprised.
