These are just some of the activities in which our AJ confirmands participate during the school year. They attend Abington, Cheltenham, Lower Moreland, Germantown Academy, Barrack Hebrew Academy, Masterman, and Springfield. Their days are filled with academics and activities, and yet they all find time to come to Confirmation class

on Tuesday nights. They are teens who are committed to Jewish life and learning — both formally at JTC and Barrack, and informally through USY, Camp Ramah, Camp Harlem, and at Adath Jeshurun and in their homes.

AJ's Confirmation class of 2018 (5778) has 16 impressive teens who became b'nai mitzvah three years ago. On **Saturday morning, May 19**, they will be back on the bimah. Many of them have known each other since preschool. Others have joined at later dates (but you would think they have always been part of the class). They stay connected through AJ even though they may not spend most of their days together.



# Ch-ch-changes!

We are doing a lot of changing at AJ these days. I know that changes are unsettling and difficult, so I want to offer some background as to why I am, perhaps, more comfortable than others with the changes. When I am not wearing my AJ hat, my day-to-day life involves helping families move to retirement communities. So change is all around me, whether it's at AJ or at work.

And it's not just change for change's sake. We are always working to improve people's lives. From a congregation prospective, the changes that we are tackling stem from our budget deficit. As many of you have heard me say, we will not pass a budget that has a deficit. While this change will be changing dramatic in a lot of different ways, it will allow us to improve the lives of our congregants by staying continuing to offer to our members the things the same that we have all come to love about AJ.

From a business perspective, change is a part of doing business at my company, S3Living. We help families who are considering independent living by representing them as they move to either a continuing care retirement community (CCRC) or a 55+ Active Adult Community. Recently, we helped a family move to a CCRC because living on its own had become too difficult to do. When the couple embraced their new community lifestyle, they





In 5779, the next Jewish calendar year, we will observe a leap year. Purim occurs mid-month Adar, but during a leap year, we have Adar I and Adar II. The two months of Adar occur seven times every nineteen years and Purim is formally celebrated in the second month of Adar.

This little kernel of information explains every rendition of, "Oh boy, the holidays are late this year!" or "Can you believe <u>Hanukkah</u> is over next year before the Xmas decorations are up in the stores (uh, not a chance!)." The occurrence of the leap month pushes every holiday ahead a month. Then, ours being a lunar calendar, we move back until the next leap year.

What this all means for us in the Purim Shpiel world of Old York Road, however, is that there will be a few extra weeks after the Adath Jeshurun/Beth Sholom Players musical and Purim, affording us more precious rehearsal time.

So consider expanding your horizons and mark your calendars now — the first rehearsal is already set for February 25, 2019 at 7:00 PM and the next opportunity like this (the next Jewish leap year) won't come 'til 2022!



### Celia Ruth Bluestine (April 14, 2018)

**Special Interests and Hobbies:** I am very active in Pennsylvania GirlChoir and musical ensembles at Cedarbrook Middle School. I play the violin, and sing in the grade choir as well as a select choir. I've enjoyed getting to work with Hazzan in preparation for my bat mitzvah.

### AJ in the News

The snowstorm at the beginning of March left its mark on Elkins Park, and many residents, businesses and organizations lost power. Fortunately, AJ was not among those, but our neighboring synagogues were not so lucky. The following is an excerpt from the cover article from the March 15 edition of the Jewish Exponent, entitled "Community Unites Following Power Outages," written by Selah Maya Kighelboim.

...Many who lost power March 2 (a Friday) still lacked it the next morning. This included synagogues that had intended to hold services, such as Reform Congregation Keneseth Israel in Elkins Park. KI was unable to have its Shabbat service that evening and had to make a decision about what to do for a Bat Mitzvah it was supposed to hold the next morning for Olivia Kramaroff.

KI began considering alternative scenarios for the Bat Mitzvah, including having it without power in a sunny lobby or perhaps hosting the service in the same location as the party, Senior Rabbi Lance J. Sussman said. But Kramaroff insisted that her Bat Mitzvah be held in a synagogue.

So KI Executive Director Brian Rissinger reached out to **Robert Friedman**, the executive director of Congregation Adath Jeshurun, to ask for help. Adath Jeshurun opened its doors and offered its chapel space upstairs for the Bat Mitzvah, while it held its regular Saturday morning service in an auditorium on the ground floor. This ensured that the sound from the two services wouldn't interfere with each other, and the Bat Mitzvah could be held in the nicer space.

This new space was smaller than their own sanctuary, Sussman said, and so it created a more intimate environment.

"Because everybody knew that we were flexing, so to speak — not flexing our muscles but flexing our adaptability — there was kind of a relaxed feeling about the whole service," Sussman said.

Friedman received a text from Beth Sholom Congregation as well about the possibility of having a joint service, which they had done together in the past. The Beth Sholom community joined Adath Jeshurun in its auditorium downstairs for services that Saturday morning and evening. Some members of Melrose B'nai Israel Emanu-El, which shares a building with KI, joined the services as well.

Friedman also learned that Beth Sholom's preschool was supposed to have a fundraiser later that day, so he offered up space at Adath Jeshurun for that, too.

Everyone, Friedman said, felt good about being able to help.

"When something bad happens," Friedman said, "it's human nature that you tend to want to come together to try to help out your neighbor."



# Ossi's Champignon Pashtida—Israeli-style Crustless Ouiche

(Vegetarian/Dairy)

Compliments of chefs Ossi Nussbaum and Lorna Rosenberg.

2 small containers fresh mushrooms (sliced) 1 large onion

1/2 cup self-rising flour (equivalent to 1/2 cup regular flour + 1 teaspoon baking powder)

1 cup cottage cheese

2/3 cup light sour cream

2 eggs

1/3 cup shredded hard cheese (mozzarella, cheddar, etc.)

Salt and pepper to taste

Dill (optional)

Grease a medium size lasagna pan/casserole dish. Sauté, if desired, onions and mushrooms first (sautéing optional). Mix all ingredients together in bowl. Pour into greased pan. Bake at 340 degrees: in a regular oven, 45 minutes; in a convection oven: 20 to 30 minutes. Test with toothpick to confirm doneness.




