AJ Gets Ready for a New Way Forward!

Congregation Adath Jeshurun is on the cusp of a new era in its venerable 160-year history.

We are entering a one-year period of transition during which many changes will occur. For the next twelve months, while **Hazzan Howard Glantz** maintains a full-time clerical presence at AJ, we will be welcoming **Rabbi Barry Kenter**, our new part-time, interim rabbi. By December, we will be engaged in a search for a new full-time rabbi.

Beyond the issue specific to members of the clergy, AJ finds itself at a crossroads with respect to the manner in which it will embrace the future and remain a vibrant and dynamic synagogue community as we go through the next decade of the twenty-first century and beyond. AJ is not alone in this landscape: The Conservative Movement and the other progressive denominations of organized Judaism face declining membership and involvement, both locally and nationally, and are challenged with devising creative ways of renewing interest and vitality.

This new era presents both a critical challenge and an unprecedented opportunity for our congregation. To meet the goal of ensuring that AJ emerges as a vibrant, self-sustaining and growing inter-generational Jewish community that meets the needs of our multi-faceted membership, in late winter AJ president **David Reibstein** asked AJ members **Skip and Naomi Atkins**, **Neil Wernick** and **Michele Rifkin** to spearhead a new initiative to take the congregation forward. Known as the "AJ New Way Forward," or AJNWF, its four leaders have been organizing a process which strives to offer a historically unique approach to synagogue planning. Unlike previous strategic planning efforts at AJ, at its core AJNWF is an entirely grassroots effort which will involve, from the outset, as many members of the AJ community as are willing to engage and do the work of change. The first phase identified core constituency groups that represent the gamut of the AJ community. Each of these constituency groups is led by one or two representative members and, along with the AJNWF leadership team, those individuals comprise the AJNWF Steering Committee.

AJ's 160th Annual Meeting Report

Hello Everyone!

I want to share with you excerpts from my remarks at AJ's 160th Annual Meeting. It is a condensed version, because the original 11 pages would take up the entire newsletter!

We are celebrating the 160th anniversary of AJ and it's an extremely important time in our congregation's history. Our new normal acknowledges that we have different constituencies in our congregation and that we need to cater to all of them. What makes AJ special is that we are a diverse group of families that is open-minded and hamish and caring and thoughtful. We don't all express our Judaism in the same way. But we all care about the past, present, and future of AJ.

My belief is that AJ should provide value for what its different constituencies are looking for in a congregation. We need to acknowledge and recognize that there are enough common interests within those constituencies that AJ, as a whole, will be vibrant and integral.

Let's turn to some of the highlights of the last 12 months.

Beth Sholom

As you know, our two years of merger negotiations with Beth Sholom have ended. I want to thank all the primary participants; there are too many to mention. I want to thank them for their time, patience, diplomacy, meetings, phone calls, golf games, conference calls, sidebars, put-ups, put-downs, inconveniences, and anything else they may have dealt with.

And thank you to **Bruce Armon**. Bruce led these meetings and regardless of the result, whether we made the right decision or not, Bruce stewarded AJ through a difficult minefield. He is to be commended for all that he has done for AJ and I want to single him out with a very special thank you.

Balanced Budget

In the past year, for the first time in many years, we right-sized our budget. We have a balanced budget that projects an equal amount of revenue and expenses for the upcoming fiscal year. This is the first step to ensuring that AJ flourishes and thrives.

AJ Annual Fundraiser (SPEC)

On Sunday evening, June 3, we offered a thoughtful tribute to **Eddie and Shelia Chacker** and heard from the Stapitol Ceps (Capitol Steps). It was an evening to remember. With 99% percent of the precincts reporting, we have raised more than \$100,000. This number is significantly important because it continues our run of netting more than \$100,000 for this fundraiser.

Let's talk about some present initiatives.

Clergy

On June 9, we had a special evening honoring **Rabbi Kobrin.** There are pictures and tributes that you can find on the AJ website as part of that celebration. Go to the website homepage (www.adathjeshurun.info) and click on the link at the end of the "Digital Scrapbook for Rabbi Kobrin" scrapbook, or go to the scrapook directly at www.carrajoy.wixsite.com/rkscrapbook.

I am extremely excited to report to the congregation that **Rabbi Barry Kenter** and I have agreed to terms of a contract that will make him our part-time, interim rabbi. Rabbi Kenter is a part-time, interim rabbi because I feel that we have clergy to provide care and spirituality to AJ when Rabbi Kenter is not at AJ. Of course, I am talking about **Hazzan Glantz**, who is about to enter into his 15th year as our hazzan. In those 15 years, Hazzan has been a tremendous asset to the congregation, providing ritual, spiritual, and of course, musical excellence to our service and lives.

Federation Housing

Since last year, a small committee and I have been talking with Federation Housing, Inc. in an effort to secure a real estate transaction whereby the north side of our building will be removed and in its place, a 50-unit apartment building will be constructed that will be owned and operated by Federation Housing.

The key takeaways for now are as follows:

- 1. We have not entered into any permanent agreement and will not do so without hearing from the congregation.
- 2. The transaction in question calls for no change to either of our prayer spaces, i.e., the Strauss Chapel and the sanctuary. It will allow us to upgrade many of the building systems while retrofitting the balance of the building that we are left with.

- 3. In the part of the building that is left, we will be able to accommodate all of the current groups that operate out of our building on a daily basis including the preschool, KleinLife: Montgomery County, the havurah, JQuest, and everyone else.
- 4. The improvements to the building and campus will include an elevator to service the first and second floors as well as upgrades to the Orleans Auditorium and other areas of the building. Further, there will be an upgraded outdoor multi-purpose space that can be used for services and other community events.

The purpose of this transaction is to create an environment and building that recognizes AJ's true needs, as well as raises more than one million dollars for the congregation. Federation Housing has been an excellent partner in this transaction, and I view this potential development as a win for AJ and for the greater community.

Website

One of the things that we need to do in terms of infrastructure is much less physical than developing senior housing. And it won't take as long, either.

AJ is upgrading our website. Thanks to **Maxine Croul** who has spearheaded this effort, along with **Missy Ufberg** and **Marjorie Trager**, AJ will soon be unveiling a modern, sophisticated website that more closely reflects to the public and to our members, who we are and what are trying to accomplish at AJ.

In terms of what we are trying to accomplish at AJ, let's turn to the future:

Our 160th Year

As we start the 160th year at AJ, we cherish the honor and the privilege of the AJ Way that we have all taken part in. We have such a mosaic history, and a ruach that is truly special.

We will cherish that ruach in ways that have not been determined yet. Stay tuned for the next time you will hear from me on this bimah... Yes, the Kol Nidre appeal speech is in process and we'll use it to unveil the special ways in which we will celebrate 160 years, and, of course, raise funds for the congregation as well.

AJ New Way Forward

Naomi and Skip Atkins and Michele Rifkin and Neil Wernick will be the team leaders of the AJ New Way Forward initiative. (This section is intentially abbreviated because there is a front-page article on this topic, that I hope you will have a chance to read.)

New Rabbi Search

The last topic that I want to touch on tonight is the search for a new rabbi.

We will be hiring a new rabbi in the late spring of next year. In order to do that, we will empower a new, as-of-yet unidentified group of individuals to be the rabbi search committee. It is premature to embark on that process because I want to the AJ New Way Forward Team to continue their process, prior to starting the search. Also, rabbi candidates have not been identified yet, so we have some time.

If you are interested in participating on the committee (or being considered for the rabbi position), please let me or one of the executive committee members know and we'll discuss it in the upcoming months.

So tonight, we have touched on many topics. And I would be remiss in leaving the following unsaid. In the past year, since I have been acting as your president, I have come to rely tremendously on the support and help of a group of people that too often do not get enough of the credit for our success.

I want to acknowledge and sincerely thank all of those who are on staff at AJ. This congregation is effective in fulfilling its mission because of our professional team, from the rabbi to the custodial staff. As a congregation we ask a lot of the people we employ. And on behalf of the congregation, I want to say thank you and kol hakavod.

In conclusion, I want to express to you that I believe that our opportunity is in front of us. In short, all we have to do is offer value to all the constituencies that make up the fabric of AJ. And in that manner we will be living up to our belief at AJ that Judaism is deeply meaningful, compelling, and responsive to the needs and concerns of our people and our world.

Once the constituency group chairs were secured, a series of parlor meetings was organized to provide an unfettered opportunity for members who identify with each specific group to express their thoughts and feelings about where AJ finds itself now, and their wishes and ideas for where it should be in the future. The parlor meetings, to be held throughout the summer and early fall, are to be led by the constituency group chairs, with one or more of the leadership team present to help facilitate an open, honest, and wide-ranging discussion.

The next phase of the AJNWF process will assemble the data obtained in the parlor meetings into a series of targeted questions as part of a synagogue-wide membership survey. The goal is to quantify the sentiments expressed in the parlor meetings. The findings will be presented to the congregation in a series of Town Hall meetings in late fall. Ultimately, AJNWF will compile the findings of the several months-long process and issue a report with recommendations to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors which will reflect the goals and ideas of the entire membership regarding AJ's future direction. The report will also inform the rabbi search committee so that its efforts will reflect the spirit and findings of AJNWF in selecting our next rabbi.

The key to the success of the AJNWF initiative will be membership-wide participation and complete transparency in the process, with ongoing communication among the steering committee, AJNWF participants, its leadership team, the Executive Committee and Board of Directors, and the rabbi search committee. This communication will take numerous forms, including email, synagogue mailings, a listserv, the AJ News and website. In addition, we have created a blog at www.AJNWF.blogspot.com to memorialize and archive chronologically all important project documents. Please visit the blog site and sign up for email notifications.

Now is the time for you to help. We need everyone's input, because we all care deeply about the future of AJ. Please contact us and become part of the process, part of the conversation, and an integral part of AJ's future.
