BRUCHIM HABAIM-WELCOME TO ISRAEL!

- Arrival at Ben Gurion airport at 7:25am.
- (Assistance upon arrival by Keshet representatives).
- Visit the Neot Kedumim Biblical Nature Reserve to see the special Sukkot exhibit.
- Picnic Lunch

Sunday, October 16 HOL HAMOED SUKKOT-THIS YEAR IN JERUSALEM

Tuesday, October 18 SHOAH TO TEKUMA/ENVIRONMENTAL COEXISTENCE

Breakfast at hotel

Track 1: (Shoah to Tekumah)

- We learn and remember at the Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial complex, with visits to the Historical Museum and Childrens' Memorial.
- Lunch break (on own)
- We remember Israel's heroes at the Mt. Herzl Military Cemetery.

Track 2: (Environmental Coexistence)

- Program with EcoPeace Middle East in the "Good Waters Community" of the village of Wadi Fuqin on the outskirts of Jerusalem.
- "Shuk & Cook" at Machaneh Yehuda. Visit various vendors in the shuk with a chef to buy ingredients for the <u>lunch</u> we will all cook together.
- Afternoon at leisure.

- Return to the hotel for lecture: Rabbi Peretz Rodman, on conversion and the Masorti movement in Israel

Wednesday, October 19 WHAT PRICE FREEDOM?/ ON THE PERIPHERY

Track 1: (What Price Freedom?)

- Early breakfast and checkout from the hotel.
- Depart for the Dead Sea Region. En route, optional photo op with "Shushi" the camel at the "Sea Level" marker.
- Ascend Herod's mountain fortress of Masada by cable-car. Explore why the Jewish rebels chose to live here after the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans. Descend by cable-car to the visitor's center.
- <u>Enjoy lunch</u> and floating in the Dead Sea at a Private Beach at Ein Bokek.
- Continue to the Negev.

Track 2: (On the Periphery)

- Learn about Netafim, which revolutionized drip-water agriculture around the world, at the factory on Kibbutz Hatzerim.
- <u>Enjoy a home hospitality lunch</u> featuring North African cuisine prepared by one of the "Culinary Queens of Yerucham". Over lunch, our hosts will share their family's personal story of aliyah in the 1950s and arrival to Yerucham.
- Discussion on Ben Gurion's vision of "making the desert bloom" by his grave overlooking the Wilderness of Zin, where the Children of Israel wandered after the Exodus.
